### STRUCTURE

**10:00-11:00 a.m.** – Facilitated by a certified Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP), this portion of the group focuses on interest-driven activities:

- Practicing gestures, drawing, writing, or using communication books for functional communication
- Role-playing life situations
- Reviewing and discussing movies, plays, or books
- Quarterly community outings

**11:00-11:30 a.m.** – Facilitated by an SLP Assistant, an SLP Intern, or a volunteer, clients engage in language-related games to:

- Practice communication strategies
- Enhance understanding of directions
- Improve verbal expression
- Facilitate social interactions

### PURPOSE

- To practice communication in a supportive environment
- To connect with others with aphasia
- To emphasize functional communication for those of all communication abilities
- To increase confidence for community participation
